## 2022 Irrigation Season

Due to the extreme drought conditions in the Weber Basin drainage system, we have been informed by our water supplier, Weber Basin, that **the following restrictions are in place for the 2022 season:**

- *Delayed charging of the secondary irrigation/agricultural system to mid-May.*
- *All new landscapes must adhere to the watering restrictions.*
- *One day per week watering of lawns and gardens.*
  - *20 minutes pop-up sprays, 40-minutes rotors*
- *One day per week hand watering of established trees and shrubs.*
- *No hosing down sidewalks or driveways.*
- *Wholesale and retail secondary irrigation contracts will be reduced by 60%.*
- *Early shutoff of secondary irrigation/agricultural system in mid-September.*

## Emergencies

If you see water surfacing in the street at any time, please, notify Bountiful Irrigation District.

## Start-Up Dates

We anticipate the irrigation water will turn on beginning the **week of May 9<sup>th</sup> (west of I-15)** and the **week of May 16<sup>th</sup> (east of I-15)**. Each area takes most of the week to fill completely.

**Each property owner west of I-15** should turn their own secondary valve off before May 1st to avoid potential flooding problems.

**Each property owner east of I-15** should turn their secondary control or main control valve off (1/4 turn clockwise to close) before May 1st to avoid potential flooding problems.

## From the Manager

Dear Residents,

We are in one of the worst droughts on record. The restrictions that are in place are necessary to sustain enough water in Weber Basin's reservoirs to supply next year's drinking water. Some wonder if one watering per week is even worth it. The simple answer is yes. One watering per week will keep the roots alive. Grass is remarkably resilient. During severe drought, rather than die, grass will go dormant and take on a straw or golden color but will recover as temperatures cool, and water becomes available. Avoid excessive traffic on dormant grass.

We ask every resident to follow the restrictions diligently. We will do our best to monitor the water use throughout the district, but please understand that there is no way to respond to every wasting water report that we receive. Rather than reporting everyone you see disregarding the water restrictions, please use your time promoting conservation and the available resources.
